A LITURGY OF REMEMBRANCE. Next Sunday at 3.30 we will remember all our dead at a special service bringing to an end our annual November remembrance of those we have loved who have died. We will pray for all those whose names you have sent in over the past few weeks, for past parishioners, for victims of violence, and for those who have nobody to pray for them. There is a good tradition of praying for the Holy Souls in this parish. It would be good to see this tradition continued next Sunday.

As was mentioned last week today is **PRISONERS' SUNDAY**. We usually send £100 to the Catholic Charity which cares for the needs of prisoners and their families. This charity used to be called the **BOURNE TRUST** but is now known as **PACT** - which stands for Prison Advice and Care Trust.

After the 10.0 Mass today in the Waterton Hall there's the children's First Holy Communion Class. Fr Turner will have a word with the parents of the First Holy Communion children in the Rectory at the same time.

Decision time has come with regard to the use of the chapel at Durrhill House. There are so few lady residents left that it is no longer justified to have an 8.15 Mass there on Sundays. Last Sunday there were only twelve at that Mass, and of them just two were residents. We had a consultation after last Sunday's Mass and decided that the last Mass in that chapel would be next Sunday - so from the First Sunday of Advent the chapel will be closed. In one way it is very sad that after a hundred years Mass will no longer be celebrated at Durrhill House. On the other hand times change and the ladies now find their home in smaller units throughout the city and elsewhere instead of a larger institution which for a century has given them a loving home.
