FEAST OF THE BLESSED TRINITY
JUNE 15TH 2003



NEXT THURSDAY is the feast of the BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST. It is a Holyday of Obligation, and there are extra Masses in Our Lady's at 8.0 am and 7.0 pm, with a Mass at ALSTON at 6.0 pm.

Today we welcome to our parish Fr Roche OSA from Birmingham who is preaching at all the Masses and appealing for the Augustinian Missions in Africa and elsewhere. There will be a second collection after Holy Communion to help these dedicated missionaries in their work. We know you will respond with your usual generosity.

Sad news to tell the parish. Fr Hugh, after five years here, is being sent by the Bishop from our parish to English Martyrs in Preston. There have been many clergy moves announced in the diocese which are to take place at the beginning of September. We are fortunate in being able to welcome a replacement assistant priest - Fr William Glasswell who is at present is attached to Lancaster Cathedral. Later there will be an opportunity to record our appreciation for all the great work Fr Hugh has done in Our Lady's.

The SVP is reviving the practice of having a Mass for the sick and housebound of the parish. This will take place at 4.30 on Sunday July 13th and will be followed by a tea party on the lawn (weather permitting - otherwise in the Rectory). Transport for those who need it will be arranged, and the Sacrament of the Sick will be administered during Mass. Let any SVP member know of your intention to be there and if you need a lift.

Next Sunday, at the 10.0 Mass, many of our children will be making their **FIRST HOLY COMMUNION**. Pray for them as they reach this important stage in their Journey of Faith.

Chris and Peter Fitzsimmons would like to say a big and heartfelt THANK YOU to everyone for the support you have given us both recently.

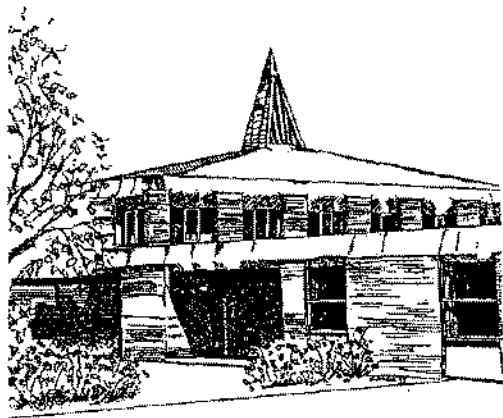
