So, as usual, we express our thanks to Winnie Poland, Irene Rome, Graham Sewell, and Noel Dias who do the routine accounts, and to Terry Noctor our parish Gift Aid organiser. There are also four teams of Offertory Collection counters. All give freely of their time, keep us solvent, and make sure the parish priest remains on the right side of the law!

NOTES

1. The SVP look after their own accounts. The Justice and Peace Group look after your CAFOD donations. These monies do not appear in the above report. The two groups report to you separately.
2. We are in a very healthy position as regards the Bank, but you may remember that was because we were left a generous £35,000 legacy last year. Peter Burns who left this money to the parish asked that it be devoted to an important parish initiative. After consultation with the Parish Pastoral Development Group it was thought that the part financing of a Youth Worker for three years was a worthy memorial to the generosity of Peter Burns.
3. You will notice that Social Events brought in only half the amount that was raised last year. That was because we didn't have a Summer Fayre in 2002. This, of course, will be remedied next week!
4. Offertory collections are a bit down – but Gift Aid revenue is up. It's an easy way to increase your giving to the parish if you are a tax payer – all at no cost to yourself. Please use this opportunity of increasing your generosity to the parish. There are appropriate Gift Aid forms at the back of church.
5. Property improvements included the rebuilding of an unsafe boundary wall between ourselves and our neighbours. Schools' Costs included our share of the resurfacing of an extensive area of St Cuthbert's school yard.
6. Special Collections (which obviously appear both as income and expenditure) are considerably down this last year. This was because we didn't have any emergency disaster collections except one for the children of Iraq which was handled by the Justice & Peace Group.
